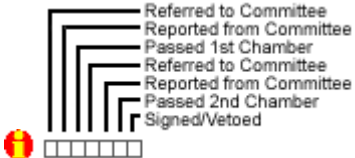

Creates Ida's Law which directs the Bureau of Investigation to create an Office of Liaison for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons to work with local agencies and law enforcement to assist with locating missing Indigenous persons.

Prohibits Medicaid and any other state or federal reimbursement for health care providers which are found guilty of trafficking fetal body parts in violation of state or federal law; EMERGENCY.

Creates the Second Amendment Sanctuary State Act which prohibits any state agency or local authority from accepting any funds or implementing any program to impair the rights of firearm owners in the state; EMERGENCY.

Permits municipalities to allow licensed and authorized personnel to carry concealed firearms in municipal buildings.
