Everything You Need to Know

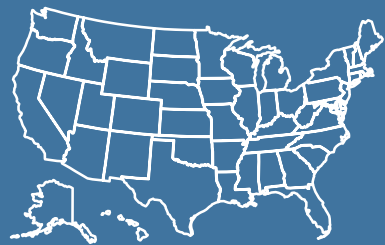


70% of respondents surveyed by NPR/Ipsos support the resettlement of Afghans who supported the U.S. military in Afghanistan and who now face persecution since the U.S. withdrawal from the country in September 2021.



Of the 2.6 million displaced Afghans, 80% are women and children.

Oklahoma has welcomed over 1,800 Afghan refugees - the third largest number of any state in the U.S., and the largest number per capita of all 50 states.



A bipartisan, bicameral Afghan Adjustment Act has been filed! Now we need our delegates to vote on it.

These families left everything behind when they fled to reestablish their lives in a new country. Now we must act to help them secure their futures as our neighbors.



If Congress passes the Afghan Adjustment Act, Afghan arrivals will have pathways to status adjustments that will allow them to stay safely in Oklahoma to build new lives.
